Introduction: This booklet contains a list of ministries and activities here at Epiphany of the Lord Parish. Its purpose is to acquaint not only newcomers but to encourage all parishioners, new and old, to be involved in at least one or more ministries..

I. Parish Ministries, Committees, Fundraising, Societies.

Pastoral Council - Epiphany of the Lord Parish has a pastoral council whose members are chosen in a discernment process and are responsible for pastoral planning. Terms last 2 years. The council meets 4 times per year. The intention is to provide the pastor with support on pastoral planning.

Epiphany of the Lord Parish Altar Rosary Society - An organization of dedicated men and women (all women of the parish are considered members) whose main focus is to encourage love for the Eucharist and Mary through practice of prayers and devotion. Our goal is to assist our Pastor in a variety of ways needed for the parish by encouraging the men and women of our parish to work for the Church and the community. Our society takes on the responsibility for the costs of the hosts and wine; maintaining all altar linens; cleaning of the church carpets; and meeting other parish needs. Upon the death of a parishioner the Society prays the rosary when requested by the family. Meetings to be determined but are generally monthly.

Properties and Maintenance Committee - This committee monitors the ongoing maintenance, upkeep, and capital improvements of the properties. The committee needs parishioners who have knowledge and expertise in the area of maintenance. They will be in contact directly with the business/facilities manager. The time commitment for this committee varies.

II. <u>Liturgical Ministries</u>

Children's Liturgy of the Word - A ministry for children during the Sunday Liturgy of the Word. This program consists of readings and activities to help children more fully participate in the Liturgy of the Word at an age-appropriate level. It is generally intended for children 3-7 (or through 2nd grade until First Communion). No registration is needed for your child to participate. This takes place at our Genesee St. Campus at St. Stephen Church during the 9:30 AM Mass. Adult and young adult leaders, helpers, and aids are needed. The person/persons responsible leads the children out before the first reading to a room located within the Church. The children are returned back to their seats during the Preparation of the Gifts. (*Safe environment course is required, and available online.)

Eucharistic Ministers - Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are lay persons who help administer the Eucharistic Body and Blood at Mass. These ministers are given training with on-going enrichment. Scheduling depends on the person's availability and the needs of the parish. Men, women, and young persons (16 yrs. plus after Confirmation) are invited to join this ministry after a period of discernment.

Eucharistic Ministers - Home Visitors - Eucharistic Ministers are welcome to extend their ministry to the homebound, hospitals, and nursing homes of the parish. This is a special ministry to parishioners who are permanently or temporarily unable to come to church. Contact the Parish office 419-698-1519 if you have any questions. Greeters - Parishioners, both men, women, young, and old are welcome to minister in the welcoming of all to our Liturgical Celebrations in order to support our faith journeys. Schedules are worked out according to both greeter's and parish needs.

Lectors - Anyone both men and women, of any age who feel the call to proclaim the Word of God at Eucharist and other liturgical celebrations are invited to participate. Initial training is given with on-going enrichment. Schedules are worked out according to both lector and parish needs. **Contact:** Kathy Singlar ksinglar@oregoncs.org 419-262-4216

Sacristans - These are the behind-the-scenes people who take care of the ordinary but necessary needs of the liturgical celebrations: opening & locking up the Church, cleaning, care of candles, vessels, etc. (*Safe environment course is required.) Schedules are worked out according to both sacristan and parish needs.

Servers - They are usually the younger members of the Parish community. Adult servers have become necessary for Holy Days and funerals and are welcome to serve at weekend Masses. Schedules are worked out according to both server and parish needs.

Ushers - greeting people, and collecting the offertory during Mass.

Choir Members and Musicians - The community welcomes all parishioners to join in song and prayer with the choirs, either as a singer or a musician during the Masses and celebrations. Your gifts will enrich our choir. Practice times are customarily Tuesday evenings but can vary with seasonal needs.

Decoration Committee - Committee members are responsible for the decoration of the liturgical spaces with emphasis on major feasts and seasons such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. III. Educational Ministries

Family of Faith (formerly Religious Education) - This is our twice monthly program (September-May) for students in grades K-8 not enrolled in Catholic school. Parents are the primary catechists for their children and we do not utilize classroom catechists as we once did in a more traditional program. Our current program includes monthly presentations for all adults of the parish. All adults in the parish are encouraged to attend presentations.

<u>Volunteer needs</u>: If you are knowledgeable on a faith topic and comfortable speaking to groups, we would love to have you as a guest presenter in areas you are interested in.

Sacrament Preparation: This describes programs for baptized Catholics in 2nd grade through adulthood preparing for First Reconciliation/First Communion and/or Confirmation (8th grade through adulthood).

<u>Volunteer needs</u>: Eligible, vetted parishioners open to serving as a Confirmation sponsor when a Confirmation candidate (8th grade or older) does not have a suitable sponsor in his/her life. Volunteers must be approved by the pastor as well as meet all requirements by the Church. If you will be a sponsor to someone under the age of 18, Safe Environment training and background screening are also required. Commitment may include accompanying to regular classes, sitting with the person at Mass, as well as attending Confirmation and remaining a support to that person after Confirmation.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly RCIA) - This is a process for anyone over the age of 7 years who is either unbaptized or converting to the Catholic faith from another faith tradition.

IV. Youth Activities

Deanery Youth Group: Serves the 7th-12th grade students of our parish and surrounding parishes. Meets approximately 3 times/month. Some gatherings are Sunday evenings at Cardinal Stritch and others are Tuesday evenings at Epiphany of the Lord.

<u>Volunteer needs:</u> Individuals to help with leading activities, small groups, helping the teens grow in their faith. For Tuesday night gatherings, individually packaged snack donations are helpful. For Sundays, we need individuals or small groups to prepare, bring, and serve a full meal for 15-20 teens and adults.

Summer Programs/Totus Tuus: Depending on the program, serves 1st-12th grade students at our parish.

<u>Volunteer needs:</u> Teen volunteers needed to help with the younger youth. Housing needs and meals provided for a team of 4 (when we have the Totus Tuus program). Other misc. needs depending on the program.

Youth Retreats for the 3rd-6th grade students of the parish.

<u>Volunteer needs</u>: Teen volunteers needed to help with the younger youth. Meals needed and snacks provided for the group. Need adults to help with set up and clean up as well as be on hand for emergencies.

V. Outreach Ministries

St. Vincent de Paul Society - The Epiphany of the Lord Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. This lay organization leads men and women to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those in need within our parish boundaries. We sponsor the neighborhood Birmingham Food Pantry. Funding comes from donations, memorials, and the poor box. Blue monthly envelopes are included in your yearly box of envelopes.

Birmingham Food Pantry - Distributes food on the 2nd Monday of each month from 9 am to noon. Volunteers are welcome for assistance with the distribution and preparation.

Helping Hands of St. Louis - Located at the Father Robert Armstrong Outreach Center on 443 6th street at the former St. Louis property, is an ecumenical service to the needy of the area. Daily meals are offered Monday through Friday. Breakfast is served on Monday, Wednesday, & Friday from 8-10 am. Other social services include food pantry, hygiene, clothing, and aid for utilities. Volunteers are welcome as individuals or groups. Green envelopes are included monthly in a yearly box of offertory envelopes.

Fellowship/Fundraising Committee - This committee determines, plans, and organizes fundraising events, and hosts receptions of the Parish, for the calendar year. Committee members decide on the nature of the event, locate the resources needed, and develop publicity. The events themselves then need volunteers for miscellaneous jobs; e.g., as cooks, servers, hosts, etc. Watch the bulletin for upcoming events, or consider becoming a committee member. This is a great opportunity for students or families that need service hours for school.

Finance Council - Our parish needs parishioners willing to be on this committee which oversees the parish expenditures, develops the yearly budget, and advises the pastor on general parish economical issues. Both men and women are welcome. The committee meets quarterly.

Emmaus Charismatic Prayer Group - This ministry is part of the Ministry to Catholic Charismatic Renewal, an affiliate of the Diocese of Toledo. We support the parish by offering an opportunity to understand how the Holy Spirit gives us gifts to help strengthen us, and empowers us to serve in the Church. We gather to praise God in song and prayer, listen to the Lord, teach/share, and intercede in prayer for the parish. All parishioners are invited weekly at Epiphany of the Lord, St Thomas chapel, Wednesdays 1:30-2:50 pm.

Bereavement Ministry - Members of the parish staff meet with the family of the deceased to plan the funeral liturgy. Adoration - Eucharistic Adoration is an act of worship, spending time with Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The Church is in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival whose mission is "to renew the church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist." The present focus is on parish revival. Being involved in weekly Adoration is a blessed way to be involved. Epiphany of the Lord Parish has Adoration on most Wednesdays from 3:00-5:50 pm in St. Thomas Aquinas Church. Mass follows at 6 pm for those who would like to attend.

<u>Volunteer needs</u>: To commit to an hour of prayer each Wednesday from 3:00-4:00, 4:00-5:00, or 5:00-5:50. Also to substitute for someone who is sick or otherwise unable to keep the weekly commitment. (While rare, it is important that Jesus in the exposed Blessed Sacrament, is not left unattended.) Those who can't commit to a schedule are encouraged to take time from worldly care to make a prayerful visit of any duration. Contact the Parish office 419-698-1519.

VI. Miscellaneous Activities - Check out these other great ways to participate in the life of the parish!

Devotion to the Irish Madonna - At our Genesee Street campus the portrait of the Irish Madonna was a gift to St. Stephen Church from Bishop Schrembs in 1914 at the dedication of the church. The original is in the Cathedral of Gyor, Hungary where a miracle took place on the Feast of St. Patrick following devotion to the Madonna. Traditionally this novena begins a week before the feast day of St. Patrick.

Father Hernady Memorial Garden - A perennial garden, small rose garden, and hosta garden are located by the St. Stephen Rectory at our Genesee street campus. Seasonal volunteers are needed several times during the year, to help clean up the garden in spring and fall and weed in the summer.
